MESSAGE FROM THE CO-DIRECTORS

2024 was our third full year as Co-Directors and marked the halfway point of our leadership term. It was a year for development as the Aging SMART operations team worked with members, trainees, research staff, and partners to build out the many initiatives launched in years one and two.

We held the first meeting of our external Scientific Advisory Board. Work is now underway to implement their recommendations, including the formation of two new committees; Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI), co-chaired by Drs Courtney Pollock and Julia Schmidt, and Patient Engagement, chaired by Dr Jennifer Davis.

The Research Rehabilitation Program hosted a Spring Celebration of Research Participation, bringing together researchers and study participants to honour their contributions to research.

The Centre-hosted CIHR-IA Summer Program in Aging (SPA) held in June was a major success. Planning for this event took close to a year and brought 50 trainees from across Canada, raising the Centre's profile both nationally and internationally. You can read more about SPA in this report.

In July, we hosted the second **Vancouver Summer Program (VSP) Injury Biomechanics course.**

Led by PhD student **Kaya Yoshida** with assistance from MSc student **Vishak Aathresh.** The program received excellent feedback from attendees.

We revamped cubicle space in the Robert Ho building to double the 4th floor occupancy while simultaneously creating a more light-filled and open workspace. This had an immediate impact on the culture of the 4th floor, which has become a thriving and vibrant hub.

September brought the second cohort of our **NSERC-funded Care Anywhere graduate program** focused on wearable sensors. Each Spring we highlight work from Care Anywhere trainees with a showcase. We encourage those interested to come out and join the event!

Throughout the year, the Centre benefitted from the continued engagement of our community through a number of well-attended events:
INCREASE BC, Aging SMART's Annual Research Day, monthly faculty and trainee-hosted Lunch and Learns, as well as a number of events led by the Aging SMART Trainee Committee. CIHR INSTITUTE OF AGING SUMMER PROGRAM IN AGING

The CIHR Institute of Aging Summer Program in Aging (SPA) 2024, hosted by the Centre for Aging SMART at Vancouver Coastal Health and led by Dr Teresa Liu-Ambrose, was a rich and interactive event for the over 40 trainees, mentors, invited speakers, and community partners who attended. From June 2-7, SPA 2024 addressed the multifaceted issue of ageism through a comprehensive and holistic lens. The 5-day capacity building program specifically focused on the impact ageism has on health research, delivery, and outcomes in older adults.

The program featured inspiring keynote presentations from global experts on ageism, including talks from Drs Julie Ober Allen, Iggy E-Shien Chang, Carole Estabrooks, and Sibila Marques. A considerable highlight was the panel of People with Lived Experience (PWLE) with **Dr Jim Mann**, Elder Glida Morgan, and Lily Wong who shared their expertise and valuable insights. Notable sessions covered topics related to cultural narratives on ageism and sociological perspectives, along with impactful talks on research that drives changes in healthcare and implementation trials. SPA 2024 truly underscored the value of interdisciplinary approaches in tackling complex issues like ageism.

SPA 2024 equipped the next generation of researchers with essential tools, knowledge, and networks, as well as highlighted the importance of addressing ageism in their work and daily lives.
